### **UPDATE: Lewd and Lascivious Behavior on August 13, 2018**

#### **Update to Crime Alert issued 8/13/2018 regarding Lewd and Lascivious Behavior**

On August 13, 2018, KU Public Safety issued a Crime Alert regarding Lewd and Lascivious Behavior reported on Memorial Drive on the KU campus.

On August 14, two additional reports of Lewd and Lascivious Behavior were taken, and the suspect was identified and served notice in-person by law enforcement.

KU Public Safety would like to thank the campus community for their assistance in providing information that led to the identification of the suspect.

#### **Information about Crime Alerts**

Crime Alerts may be issued via e-mail for any of the following reasons:

- to seek assistance in the investigation of a crime
- to aid in the prevention of similar crimes
- to alert the KU community to off-campus crimes or crimes not covered by the Clery Act
- to notify the KU community about criminal incidents reported on campus that represent a serious or continuing threat, pursuant to the Clery Act

#### **Do Crime Alerts mean there is an immediate threat to campus that requires immediate action?**

No. When there is an immediate threat or immediate action is required, the university will issue a Campus Alert via its multi-tiered emergency notification system, which can include text messages, email, the on-campus public address system, social media and the university website. Examples of situations that would constitute an immediate threat include an armed intruder, bomb threat, gas leak, terrorist incident, hazardous waste spill, large fire, or explosion.
